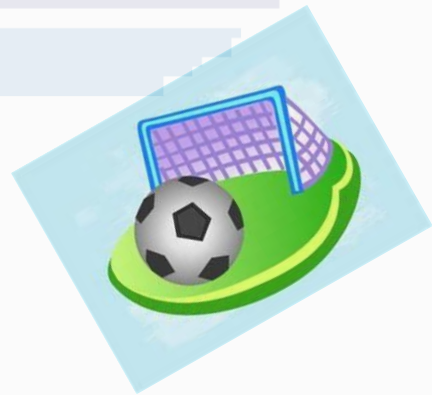

# Performing Arts

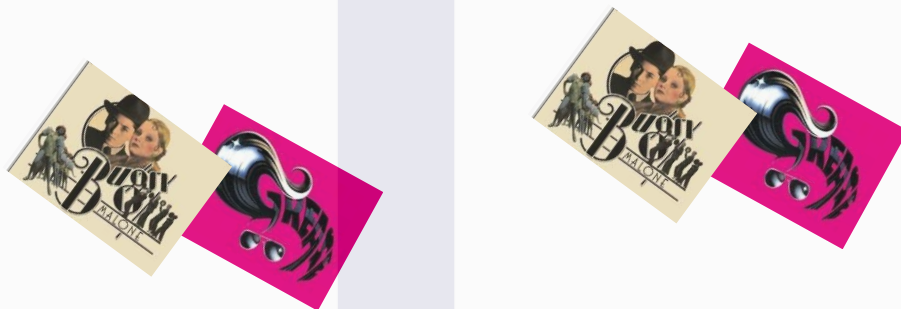
Within Performing Arts lessons, students are given opportunities to:

- Build self esteem and confidence
- Develop and demonstrate imagination
- Explore and play out feelings of life situations
- Improve listening, communication and improvisational skills
- Observe, problem solve, share thoughts and contribute ideas

At St. Peter's CofE Academy, Dance and Drama are taught from Key Stage 3 to Examination level. Each term Year 7 students enjoy half a term of Dance and half a term of Drama. In year 8 if they opt to continue with Performing Arts. A diverse range of topics and themes are taught:

Students have the opportunity to continue their interest in Performing Arts at Key Stage 4 where they can study BTEC Performing Arts. This is a practical based course that allows students to achieve a more in-depth knowledge of Dance and Drama as well as other performing skills.

## Music

**The music department consists of Miss Adamiec and a variety of peripatetic teachers that provide 1:1 extra curricular music tuition.**

In Year 7 you will learn -

- How to play instruments, sing and perform as a group • How to compose like Vivaldi!
- Learn about Music from films and video games
- Use software such as GarageBand and Logic Pro on MAC computers to help compose your own piece of music
- how to read music.

Our teaching spaces are equipped with a class set of keyboards, MAC room with 30 computers and Midi keyboards and 5 individual practice rooms as well as a wide variety of instruments that are incorporated within lessons.

We believe that music is a very important aspect of the curriculum. KS3 students develop the skills needed for critical thinking, independent learning, team work, confidence, self awareness and creativity. It also provides students with the chance to express themselves in a variety of ways.
